RESERVE POLICE OFFICER

DEFINITION: As a Reserve Police Officer, you will assist regular police officers patrolling assigned portions of the city in the prevention of crime and in the enforcement of law and order. Patrol duties may be with a regular officer, another Reserve Officer, or by yourself, depending upon the Reserve Officers classification level. Level III Reserve Officers can only work in a support role not requiring the use of general peace officer powers. Level II and Level I Reserve Officers may work field or other support assignments requiring the use of peace officer powers.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS: Candidates must have the ability to:

- Accurately observe and remember names, faces, numbers, incidents and places.
- Learn to use and properly care for firearms.
- Participate in Bi-monthly firearms qualifications.
- Think and act quickly in emergencies, judge situations, and evaluate people accurately.
- Learn, understand, interpret and apply laws, regulations, policies and procedures.
- Prepare clear, accurate and grammatically correct written reports.
- Understand and carryout oral and written directions.
- Communicate clearly and concisely, both orally and in writing.
- Work a minimum of 16 voluntary hours per month and attend a monthly meeting.

THE ABOVE LIST OF ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS IS NOT EXHAUSTIVE AND MAY BE SUPPLEMENTED AS NECESSARY BY THE EMPLOYER

EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING GUIDELINES: Educational achievement equal to the completion of the twelfth grade or a GED and successful completion of the Level III Reserve Police Officer Academy as specified in the POST Reserve Officer Standards. Subsequent completion of Level II and Level I Reserve Academies is strongly encouraged.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS: Possession of, and continuously throughout duty, a valid CA Class "C" Driver's License. Candidates must also satisfy the following:

AGE: At least 21 years of age.

MEDICAL STANDARDS: Must meet the standards recommended by POST and determined able to perform the functions of a police officer by the city's examining physician.

SKILL IN: Physical Agility.

SELECTION PROCESS: May include, but not limited to, Written, Performance and Oral Interview Exams. Candidates must also be able to pass a Police Background Investigation, Pre-employment Physical, Psychological and Polygraph Examinations.

SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION: Applicant's must:

- Not have been convicted of any crime for which punishment could have been imprisonment in a state prison or federal penitentiary.
- Must be a legal resident of the United States.
- Must maintain a telephone or cellular phone.
- Must be steadily employed and able to show self-monetary support.

All statements made in the application material are subject to verification. False Statements will cause for disqualification or discharge.
